**PROGRAMME SUNDAY 03 June 2018**

"Mineralization and sedimentology of the Matlock-Wirksworth area of Derbyshire" (leaders Dr Cathy Hollis & Catherine Breislin, Univ. of Manchester); meet at 10.30 am at National Stone Centre, Wirksworth. Lunch will be taken at around 13.00 – 13.30 at the National Stone Centre (bring own sandwiches or use cafeteria facilities). Afternoon will be spent in the Brassington area (up to around 15.30 hrs), with optional walk up to Harborough Rocks (finish c. 16.30 hrs). Some uphill walking, generally on well-established tracks; bring stout footwear.
